### Demography

- Total population: 27 million
- Religious affiliation
  - Sunni Muslims: 60%?
    - Mainly in centre and south
  - Zaydi Muslims (branch of Shia close to Sunni Islam): 40%?
    - In north
- Tribal groupings
  - Hashid
  - Bakil
  - Madhhij

### Political situation prior to 2011

- Country ruled by Ali Abdullah Saleh since 1982
  - leader of General People's Congress party
- Other political parties (more or less able to function and be represented in parliament)
  - Islah
    - Sunni party; close to Muslim Brotherhood
  - Yemeni Socialist Party
    - former ruling party of Soviet-aligned People's Democratic Republic of Yemen ('South Yemen')
  - numerous other parties

# Economic and security situation up to 2011

### Economy

- Country mismanaged and corrupt
- Dire economic situation as oil revenues decline

### Security

- Repeated rebellions by Zaydi fundamentalist
   Houthis in far north of country
- Spread of Al-Qaeda in various other areas

### Yemeni revolution: 2011

#### • 2011

- Popular uprising against Ali Abdullah Saleh's government, brutally suppressed
- With Saudi help, Saleh manages initially to cling onto power

#### • 2012

- Deal brokered involving Saudi Arabia in which Saleh steps down in favour of his deputy Abdrabbuh Mansour Hadi
- Hadi to stand down after two years with subsequent free elections

#### • 2014

 National Dialogue Conference ends after ten months, agrees document on which new constitution will be based

#### • 2015

- Agreement breaks down; Houthis take capital San'a and later former southern capital Aden
- Former President Saleh, who still controls army allies with Houthis
- Saudi Arabia and UAE launch war against Houthi-Saleh alliance

#### • 2017

Former President Saleh tries to switch alliance back to Saudis; is killed by Houthis

### **Points**

- Saudis opposed original popular uprising, fearing democratic state on their border
- Situation is complex with multiple groups
  - not correct to say that this is Houthis vs. legitimate government
  - not correct to say that this is Sunni vs. Shia conflict
  - unclear how much support Iran has provided to Houthis
- US and Britain continue to supply Saudi Arabia with vast amounts of weapons, providing targeting information, and help Saudis enforce sea blockade on Yemen

### Current humanitarian situation

- More than 10,000\* people killed, 50,000 wounded, and 2 million displaced due to the war, according to the UN
- More than 50,000 children are believed to have died in Yemen in 2017, according to Save the Children
- More than 22 million people, including 11 million children, are in need of humanitarian assistance, according to UN officials and the International Committee of the Red Cross
- More than 8 million people are totally dependent on food assistance and considered a "step away from famine", according to the UN
- An estimated 17.8 million Yemenis are considered "food insecure," meaning they do not know where their next meal will come from, according to the UN
- More than 400,000 children are suffering from acute malnutrition, according to the World Food Program
- Some 15.7 million Yemenis lack access to safe drinking water and adequate sanitation services, according to the ICRC
- Some 16.4 million Yemenis lack access to adequate health care, according to the UN
